



## Sydney Eye Hospital Foundation PROFESSORIAL UVEITIS Fellowship

The Sydney Eye Hospital Foundation offers a 12-month Professorial Uveitis Fellowship at Sydney Eye Hospital, starting in January.

The Fellow works primarily with the Professorial Unit:

- Professor Peter McCluskey
- Professor Mark Gillies
- Professor John Grigg
- Associate Professor Samantha Fraser-Bell, and
- Associate Professor Clare Fraser.

The Professorial unit provides clinical services in the areas of inflammatory eye disease, medical retina, neuro-ophthalmology and genetically determined eye disease.

The supervisor is Professor Peter McCluskey.

The Fellow participates in 30 outpatient clinics and 2 operating sessions per four-week cycle. This includes both complex uveitic cataract and glaucoma surgery.

The Fellowship is a Sydney Eye Hospital-based training position, providing hands on investigation and management of patients with inflammatory eye disease, medical retina, neuro-ophthalmology and genetically determined eye disease. The Fellow will have extensive exposure to widefield digital angiography, OCT, AngioOCT, laser and intravitreal injections, as well as electrophysiology and reporting.

The research content of the post will include being a sub investigator for Retinal clinical trials. The Uveitis Fellow will participate in Research Clinics with Professor Mark Gillies and A/Professor Samantha Fraser-Bell, gaining valuable experience in both in-house and international multi-centre clinical trials, for which the Save Sight Institute is renowned.

The Fellow will also participate in uveitis clinical research projects during the year with the expectation that one to three manuscripts will be generated.

The Fellow will be involved in the teaching and supervising of registrar and resident doctors, as well as nursing and orthoptist staff members.

We offer this Fellowship to doctors at the end of their ophthalmology training or fully qualified Ophthalmologists in their respective country of origin.

They are selected based on their experience, references and very importantly their agreed commitment to return to their country of origin to provide a uveitis and medical retina service there.
